



### Haliburton County Rail Trail Corridor Code of Conduct

- The Haliburton County Rail Trail Corridor is a multi-use trail with the following seasonal and daily usage restrictions.
  - December 1 to March 30 – Snowmobiles only.
  - April 1 to April 30 – Non-motorized activities only.
  - May 1 to November 30 – Pedestrians, cyclists, horses and ATV's including two up machines.
  - ATV's are not permitted on the Rail Trail Corridor from dusk to 10am.
  - Cars, trucks and motorcycles are not permitted on the Rail Trail Corridor.
- Rules and right of way are illustrated via signage posted on the Rail Trail Corridor.
- Riders on the Rail Trail Corridor must obey the Safety Rules and all Regulations related to their activity.
- Users with pets must keep them under control while on the Rail Trail Corridor and pick up their faeces.
- All users are to be courteous with other users of the Rail Trail Corridor.
- All users must stay on the Rail Trail Corridor and not venture onto adjacent private property.
- All users must obey Rail Trail Corridor signage and use caution at curves, hills, driveways and road crossings.

 <p><b>HIKERS</b></p>	<p>Yield trail to equestrians. Allow equestrians and bicyclists to pass.</p>	 <p><b>ATV'S</b></p>	<p>Stay on Trail Yield to non-motorized traffic. Yield to hikers and equestrians. Control dust.</p>
 <p><b>BICYCLISTS</b></p>	<p>Ride on open trails only. Control your bicycle. Always yield trail. Never scare animals. Plan ahead.</p>	 <p><b>EQUESTRIANS</b></p>	<p>Control your horse. Avoid cross-country riding.</p>
